CHAIRMAN'S REVIEW

It is my pleasure to present to you the un-audited financial statements of Atlas Money Market Fund (AMF), Atlas Income Fund (AIF), Atlas Stock Market Fund (ASMF) and Atlas Gold Fund (AGF) for the first quarter / period ended 30 September 2013 of the FY 2013-14.

The Economy

During the period July-August FY 2013-14, total exports stood at US\$ 4.1 billion as compared to US\$ 3.9 billion worth of exports reported in the same period last year. The foreign exchange reserves of the country stood at US\$ 9.9 billion as on 27 September 2013 with SBP's share of US\$ 4.6 billion in the total liquid foreign exchange reserves. Foreign remittances for the period July-August FY 2013- 14 stood at US\$ 2.64 billion, which was an increase of 7.05% YoY compared to the corresponding period last year. CPI inflation for the period of July - September FY 2013-14 was recorded at 7.4%. SBP in its latest monetary policy statement announced a 50bps increase in discount rate from 9% to 9.5%. This increase was made by the State bank in order to curtail the inflationary pressure that could be detrimental to both economic growth and to the value of rupee in the long-term.

Fund Operations - AMF

The Net Asset Value per unit of AMF increased by 1.86% to Rs.502.73 as on 30 September 2013, thus providing an annualized total return of 7.43%. The AMF's total exposure in Treasury Bills stood at 94.72% with remaining in short term deposits with banks / cash. AMF presents a good investment opportunity for investors to earn attractive returns while maintaining high liquidity with low risk. The net assets of the Fund stood at Rs.5.27 billion, with 10.48 million units outstanding as of 30 September 2013.

The Investment Committee of Atlas Asset Management Limited, the Management Company of AMF, under the authority delegated by the Board of Directors, approved an interim bonus distribution of Rs.3.00 per unit (0.60% on the face value of Rs. 500 per unit). This is in addition to the aggregate Interim Bonus Distribution of Rs.6.00 per unit (1.20% on the face value of Rs.500 per unit), already distributed.

Fund Operations - AIF

The Net Asset Value per unit of AIF increased by 1.88% to Rs.513.19 as on 30 September 2013, this works out to 7.46% on an annualized basis. AIF's current asset allocation is 66.50% in Treasury bills, 19.84% in Margin Trading System, 8.83% in TFC/ Sukuk, 1.06% in Pakistan Investment Bonds and remaining in bank deposits/others. AIF presents a good investment opportunity for investors to earn attractive returns in medium term investment horizon. The net assets of the Fund stood at Rs.2.34 billion with 4.56 million units outstanding as of 30 September 2013.

The Investment Committee of Atlas Asset Management Limited, the Management Company of AIF, under the authority delegated by the Board of Directors, in their meeting held on 4 October 2013 approved an interim bonus distribution of Rs.9.50 per unit (1.90% on the face value of Rs.500 per unit) for the quarter ended 30 September 2013.

Fund Operations - ASMF

The Net Asset Value per unit of ASMF increased by 5.65% to Rs.420.23 as on 30 September 2013. The benchmark KSE-100 index has increased by 3.94% during the same period. The KSE-100 index increased from 21,005.69 points as on 30 June 2013 to 21,832.68 points as on 30 September 2013. The ASMF's equity portfolio exposure was mainly in Oil & Gas, Commercial Banks and Electricity sectors. ASMF's strategy will continue to focus on dividend plays and stocks which are trading at relatively cheap multiples with earning growth prospects. The net assets of the Fund stood at Rs.1.06 billion, with 2.52 million units outstanding as of 30 September 2013.

Fund Operations - AGF

The Net Asset Value per unit of AGF increased by 1.10% to Rs.101.10 as on 30 September 2013. AGF has gradually increased exposure in Gold based futures contract since its launch date of 15 July 2013. During the month of August 2013 the average investment level of AGF in Gold based futures contract was 54.45% of net assets. AGF's exposure in Gold based futures contracts stood at 71.85% and with remaining in cash and cash equivalents /others as of 30 September 2013. The net assets of the Fund stood at Rs.225.88 million, with 2.23 million units outstanding as of 30 September 2013.

Ratings

• Asset Manager Rating

The Pakistan Credit Rating Agency Limited (PACRA) has maintained asset manager rating of Atlas Asset Management Limited (AAML) at "AM2-" (AM Two Minus). The rating denotes the company's very strong capacity to manage the risks inherent in asset management and meets very high investment management industry standards and benchmarks.

• Fund Stability Rating - AMF

PACRA has assigned a stability rating of "AA (f)" (Double A - Fund Rating) to the Fund. The Fund's rating denotes a very strong capacity to manage relative stability in returns and very low exposure to risks.

• Fund Stability Rating - AIF

PACRA has assigned a stability rating of "A+ (f)" (Single A Plus - Fund Rating) to the Fund. The Fund's rating denotes a strong capacity to manage relative stability in returns and low exposure to risks.

• Star Ranking - ASMF

PACRA has assigned a "4 Star" short term ranking to the Fund, and a long term "4 Star" ranking, for the FY 2011-12. The short term ranking is based on performance during the trailing twelve months period, whereas long-term star ranking is based on performance during the trailing thirty six months.

• Rating/Ranking - AGF

Not yet rated / ranked. AGF was launched on 15 July 2013.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

The sustainable economic growth over the medium term would call for a substantial increase in both the domestic and foreign investment in the economy. Fiscal reforms need to be implemented to ensure better tax collection, reduction of subsidies and reduced borrowing from the banking system. Inflation is expected to increase as electricity tariff hike, petroleum products price increase and PKR depreciation will fuel import inflation thus this all will build inflationary pressure in months to come. In the short-run successful auction of 3G license and inflows from Coalition Support Fund will create fiscal space and will also help build up foreign exchange reserves.

The Funds are committed to prudent investment procedures and will continue to provide consistent long term returns to the investors.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED) FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2013

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

- 1.1 Atlas Money Market Fund (the Fund) is an open ended Fund constituted by a trust deed entered into on 4 December 2009 between Atlas Asset Management Limited (AAML) as the Management Company and Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited (CDC) as the trustee. The investment activities and administration of the Fund are managed by AAML situated at Ground Floor, Federation House, Shahrae Firdousi, Clifton, Karachi.
- 1.2 Units of the Fund are offered for public subscription on a continuous basis since 20 January 2010, and are transferable and redeemable by surrendering them to the Fund. The Fund is listed on the Lahore Stock Exchange.
- 1.3 According to the trust deed, the objective of the Fund is to provide its investors competitive returns from a portfolio of low risk, short duration assets while maintaining high liquidity. The Fund aims to deliver this objective mainly by investing in Government securities, cash and near cash instruments which include cash in bank accounts, treasury bills, lending to deposit with scheduled banks, certificates of deposit (CODs), certificate of musharakas (COM), commercial papers, and reverse repo; with a weighted average time to maturity of not more than 90 days, and in case of a single asset, maximum time to maturity of six months. The investment objectives and policy are more fully defined in the Fund's offering document.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

- 2.1 These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting", the requirements of the Trust Deed, the Non-Banking Finance Companies (Establishment and Regulation) Rules, 2003 (the NBFC Rules), the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008 (the NBFC Regulations) and directives issued by the SECP. In case where requirements differ, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules, the NBFC Regulations or the requirements of the said directives prevail.
- 2.2 These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those of the previous financial year.

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards requires management to make estimates, assumptions and use judgments that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities and income and expenses. Estimates, assumptions and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including reasonable expectations of future events. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively commencing from the period of revision.

The significant judgments made by management in applying the accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2013.

The financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the annual financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

- 6.1 During the period, an amount of Rs.1,805,386 (2012: Rs.1,740,566) was charged on account of sales tax on management fee levied through Sindh Sales Tax on Services Act, 2011, out of which Rs.957,092 (2012: Rs.1,187,429) has already been paid to the Management Company which acts as a collecting agent.
- 6.2 The Finance Act, 2013 has enlarged the scope of Federal Excise Duty (FED) on financial services to include Asset Management Companies (AMCs) with effect from 13 June 2013. As the asset management services rendered by the Management Company of the Fund are already subject to provincial sales tax on services levied by the Sindh Revenue Board, which is being charged to the Fund as explained in note 6.1 above, the Management Company is of the view that further levy of FED is not justified.

On 4 September 2013, a Constitutional Petition has been filed in Honorable Sindh High Court (SHC) jointly by various asset management companies, together with their representative Collective Investment Schemes through their trustees, challenging the levy of FED. In this respect, the Hon'ble SHC has issued a stay order against recovery proceedings. The hearing of the petition is in progress.

In view of the pending decision, as a matter of abundant caution, the Management Company of the Fund has made a provision for FED in the books of account of the Fund with effect from 13 June 2013, aggregating to Rs.1,851,167 (30 June 2013: Rs,294,800).

Atlas Money Market Fund

6.3 The Finance Act 2008 introduced an amendment to the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 (WWF Ordinance). As a result of this amendment it may be construed that all Collective Investment Schemes / Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds whose income exceeds Rs. 0.5 million in a tax year, have been brought within the scope of the WWF Ordinance, thus rendering them liable to pay contribution to WWF at the rate of two percent of their accounting or taxable income, whichever is higher. In this regard, a Constitutional Petition has been filed by certain CISs through their trustees in the Honorable High Court of Sindh (SHC), challenging the applicability of WWF to the CISs / pension funds, which is pending adjudication. However, without prejudice to the above, the Management Company made a provision for WWF contribution in the annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2010.

During the year ended 30 June 2011, a clarification was issued by the Ministry of Labour and Manpower (the Ministry) on 8 July 2010 which stated that mutual funds are not liable to contribute to WWF on the basis of their income. However on 14 December 2010 the Ministry filed its response against the Constitutional Petition requesting the Court to dismiss the same. Show cause notices were then issued by Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) to several Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds for the collection of WWF including some of the mutual funds and one of the pension fund managed by the AMC. In respect of such show cause notices, certain Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds have been granted stay by Honorable SHC on the basis of the pending Constitutional Petition as referred above.

In March 2013, a three member bench of the Sindh High Court in its judgement on various Constitutional Petitions challenging the amendments brought in the WWF Ordinance, 1971 through the Finance Act, 2006, and the Finance Act, 2008, held that WWF is a tax and consequently, the amendments introduced in the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 through Finance Acts, 2006 and 2008 respectively (Money Bills) do not suffer from any constitutional or legal infirmity. This judgement was in contrast to the July 2011 single member bench decision of the Honorable Lahore High Court which had held such amendments as unlawful and unconstitutional for the reason that they were made through the money bills. For the CISs and Pension Funds, the issue of chargeability or otherwise of WWF levy to the CISs / Pension Funds is currently pending before the Honorable SHC.

In view of the pending decision, the Management Company of the Fund, as a matter of abundant caution, has decided to continue to maintain the provision for WWF amounting to Rs.25,494,894 (30 June 2013: Rs.23,707,325) in these condensed interim financial statements. Had the same not been made the net asset value per unit of the Fund would have been higher by Rs.2.43 (30 June 2013: Rs.3.12) per unit.

9. TAXATION

The Fund's income is exempt from Income Tax as per Clause 99 of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 subject to the condition that not less than 90% of the accounting income for the year as reduced by capital gains whether realised or unrealised is distributed amongst the unit holders. Further, as per Regulation 63 of the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008, the Fund is required to distribute 90% of the net accounting income, other than unrealized capital gains to the unit holders. The management intends to distribute at least 90% of the Fund's net accounting income earned by the year end, to the unit holders. Accordingly, no provision has been made for taxation in these condensed interim financial statements.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED) FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2013

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

- 1.1 Atlas Income Fund (the Fund) is an open ended mutual fund constituted by a Trust Deed entered into on 20 February 2003 between Atlas Asset Management Limited (AAML) as the establisher and the management company and MCB Financial Services Limited (MCBFSL) as the trustee. MCBFSL resigned on 11 June 2005 as trustee and Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited (CDC) was appointed as the Trustee with effect from that date. The Trust Deed has been revised through the Deed of Change of Trustee and First Supplemental Trust Deed dated 11 June 2005, Second Supplemental Trust Deed dated 29 October 2007, Third Supplemental Trust Deed dated 23 June 2010 and the Fourth Supplemental Trust Deed dated 12 November 2010 with the approval of the SECP. Also, the Offering Document of the Fund has been revised through the First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Supplements, dated 21 June 2005, 29 October 2007, 29 February 2008, 23 June 2010 and 12 November 2010 respectively, with the approval of the SECP. The investment activities and administration of the Fund are managed by Atlas Asset Management Limited situated at Ground Floor, Federation House, Shahrae Firdousi, Clifton, Karachi.
- 1.2 Units of the Fund have been offered for public subscription on a continuous basis from 22 March 2004, and are transferable and redeemable by surrendering them to the Fund. The Fund is listed on Lahore Stock Exchange.
- 1.3 According to the trust deed, the objective of the Fund is to provide investors one window facility to invest in diversified portfolio offering good returns and consistent growth. The Fund aims to deliver this objective mainly by investing in Government securities, cash in bank accounts, Certificate of Investments (COI), money market placements, deposits, Certificates of deposits (COD), Certificates of Musharikas (COM), TDRs, commercial paper, reverse repo, term finance certificates (TFCs)/Sukuks, transactions on Margin Trading System (MTS), spread transactions and any other instruments that may be allowed by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan. The investment objectives and policies are more fully defined in the Fund's offering document.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

- 2.1 These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting", the requirements of the Trust Deed, the Non-Banking Finance Companies (Establishment and Regulation) Rules, 2003 (the NBFC Rules), the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008 (the NBFC Regulations) and directives issued by the SECP. In case where requirements differ, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules, the NBFC Regulations or the requirements of the said directives prevail.
- 2.2 These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

3. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those of the previous financial year.

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards requires management to make estimates, assumptions and use judgments that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities and income and expenses. Estimates, assumptions and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including reasonable expectations of future events. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively commencing from the period of revision.

The significant judgments made by management in applying the accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2013.

The financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the annual financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

5.1.1 This represents shares allocated to the Fund as part of the settlement agreement finalised between Azgard Nine Limited and its creditors. As part of the settlement, 302,569 shares of Agritech Limited have been allocated to the Fund against its receivable balance of Rs.10.589 million from Azgard Nine Limited. The Fund's gross receivable against Azgard Nine Limited amounted to Rs.18.724 million out of which Rs.10.589 million has been settled as part of this agreement. In prior years, the Fund has fully provided its exposure against Azgard Nine Limited and has consequently recorded a gain of Rs.3.933 million on this settlement in the previous year. The balance receivable amounting to Rs.8.135 million remains fully provided.

- 6.1 During the period, an amount of Rs.1,485,303 (2012:Rs.576,844) was charged on account of sales tax on management fee levied through Sindh Sales Tax on Services Act, 2011, out of which Rs.805,796 (2012: Rs.380,574) has already been paid to the Management Company which acts as a collecting agent.
- 6.2 The Finance Act, 2013 has enlarged the scope of Federal Excise Duty (FED) on financial services to include Asset Management Companies (AMCs) with effect from 13 June 2013. As the asset management services rendered by the Management Company of the Fund are already subject to provincial sales tax on services levied by the Sindh Revenue Board, which is being charged to the Fund as explained in note 6.1 above, the Management Company is of the view that further levy of FED is not justified.

On 4 September 2013, a Constitutional Petition has been filed in Honorable Sindh High Court (SHC) jointly by various asset management Companies, together with their representative Collective Investment Schemes through their trustees, challenging the levy of FED. In this respect, the Hon'ble SHC has issued a stay order against recovery proceedings. The hearing of the petition is in progress.

In view of the pending decision, as a matter of abundant caution, the Management Company of the Fund has made a provision for FED in the books of account of the Fund with effect from 13 June 2013, aggregating to Rs.1,514,477 (30 June 2013: Rs,234,044).

6.3 The Finance Act 2008 introduced an amendment to the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 (WWF Ordinance). As a result of this amendment it may be construed that all Collective Investment Schemes / Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds whose income exceeds Rs. 0.5 million in a tax year, have been brought within the scope of the WWF Ordinance, thus rendering them liable to pay contribution to WWF at the rate of two percent of their accounting or taxable income, whichever is higher. In this regard, a Constitutional Petition has been filed by certain CISs through their trustees in the Honorable High Court of Sindh (SHC), challenging the applicability of WWF to the CISs / pension funds, which is pending adjudication. However, without prejudice to the above, the Management Company made a provision for WWF contribution in the annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2010.

During the year ended 30 June 2011, a clarification was issued by the Ministry of Labour and Manpower (the Ministry) on 8 July 2010 which stated that mutual funds are not liable to contribute to WWF on the basis of their income. However on 14 December 2010 the Ministry filed its response against the Constitutional Petition requesting the Court to dismiss the same. Show cause notices were then issued by Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) to several Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds for the collection of WWF including some of the mutual funds and one of the pension fund managed by the AMC. In respect of such show cause notices, certain Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds have been granted stay by Honorable SHC on the basis of the pending Constitutional Petition as referred above.

In March 2013, a three member bench of the Sindh High Court in its judgement on various Constitutional Petitions challenging the amendments brought in the WWF Ordinance, 1971 through the Finance Act, 2006, and the Finance Act, 2008, held that WWF is a tax and consequently, the amendments introduced in the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 through Finance Act, 2006 and 2008 respectively (Money Bills) do not suffer from any constitutional or legal infirmity. This judgement was in contrast to the July 2011 single member bench decision of the Honorable Lahore High Court which had held such amendments as unlawful and unconstitutional for the reason that they were made through the money bills. For the CISs and Pension Funds, the issue of chargeability or otherwise of WWF levy to the CISs / Pension Funds is currently pending before the Honorable SHC.

In view of the pending decision, the Management Company of the Fund, as a matter of abundant caution, has decided to continue to maintain the provision for WWF amounting to Rs.12,526,900 (30 June 2013: Rs.11,646,996) in these financial statements. Had the same not been made, the net asset value per unit of the Fund would have been higher by Rs.2.74 (30 June 2013: Rs.3.02) per unit.

The Fund's income is exempt from Income Tax as per Clause 99 of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 subject to the condition that not less than 90% of the accounting income for the year as reduced by capital gains whether realised or unrealised is distributed amongst the unit holders. Further, as per Regulation 63 of the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008, the Fund is required to distribute 90% of the net accounting income, other than unrealized capital gains to the unit holders. The management intends to distribute at least 90% of the Fund's net accounting income earned by the year end, to the unit holders. Accordingly, no provision has been made for taxation in these condensed interim financial statements.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED) FOR THE QUARTER ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2013

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

- 1.1 Atlas Stock Market Fund (the Fund) is an open ended mutual Fund constituted by a trust deed entered into on 29 May 2004 between Atlas Asset Management Limited (AAML) as the management company and Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited (CDC) as the Trustee. The Trust Deed has been revised through the First, Second, Third, Fourth, and Fifth Supplemental Trust Deeds dated 21 June 2005, 24 July 2006, 29 October 2007, 6 March 2008, and 4 December 2009 respectively, with the approval of the SECP. The Offering Document has been revised through the First, Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Supplements dated 21 June 2005, 24 July 2006, 29 October 2007, 6 March 2008, and 4 December 2009 respectively, with the approval of the SECP. The investment activities and administration of the Fund are managed by AAML situated at Ground Floor, Federation House, Shahrae Firdousi, Clifton, Karachi.
- **1.2** Units of the Fund are offered for public subscription on a continuous basis since 23 November 2004 and are transferable and redeemable by surrendering them to the Fund. The Fund is listed on the Lahore Stock Exchange.
- 1.3 According to the trust deed, the objective of the Fund is to provide investors one window facility to invest in a diversified portfolio of equity securities offering consistent returns and growth. The Fund aims to deliver this objective mainly by investing in equity securities of companies that are paying regular dividend, have growth prospects or are actively traded. Any amounts which have not been invested in equity securities may be invested in liquid instruments including bank deposits (excluding TDRs) and treasury bills not exceeding 90 days maturity. The investment objectives and policies are more fully defined in the Fund's Offering Document.

2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard - 34 " Interim Financial Reporting", the requirements of the Trust Deed, the Non-Banking Finance Companies (Establishment and Regulation) Rules, 2003 (the NBFC Rules), the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008 (the NBFC Regulations) and directives issued by the SECP. In case where requirements differ, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules, the NBFC Regulations or the requirements of the said directives prevail.

These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosures required in the annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies applied for the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the same as those applied in the preparation of the annual published financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements in conformity with approved accounting standards requires management to make estimates, assumptions and use judgments that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities and income and expenses. Estimates, assumptions and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including reasonable expectations of future events. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively commencing from the period of revision.

The significant judgments made by management in applying the accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2013.

The financial risk management objectives and policies are consistent with those disclosed in the annual financial statements of the Fund for the year ended 30 June 2013.

- 6.1 During the period, an amount of Rs.1,025,442 (30 June 2013: Rs.633,936) was charged on account of sales tax on remuneration of the Management Company levied through Sindh Sales Tax on Services Act, 2011, out of which Rs.885,698 (2012: Rs.589,549) has already been paid to the Management Company which acts as a collecting agent.
- 6.2 The Finance Act, 2013 has enlarged the scope of Federal Excise Duty (FED) on financial services to include Asset Management Companies (AMCs) with effect from 13 June 2013. As the asset management services rendered by the Management Company of the Fund are already subject to provincial sales tax on services levied by the Sindh Revenue Board, which is being charged to the Fund as explained in note 6.1 above, the Management Company is of the view that further levy of FED is not justified.

On 4 September 2013, a Constitutional Petition has been filed in Honorable Sindh High Court (SHC) jointly by various asset management Companies, together with their representative Collective Investment Schemes through their trustees, challenging the levy of FED. In this respect, the Hon'ble SHC has issued a stay order against recovery proceedings. The hearing of the petition is in progress.

In view of the pending decision, as a matter of abundant caution, the Management Company of the Fund has made a provision for FED in the books of account of the Fund with effect from 13 June 2013, aggregating to Rs.1,057,840 (30 June 2013: Rs.173,838).

6.3 The Finance Act 2008 introduced an amendment to the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 (WWF Ordinance). As a result of this amendment it may be construed that all Collective Investment Schemes / Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds whose income exceeds Rs.0.5 million in a tax year, have been brought within the scope of the WWF Ordinance, thus rendering them liable to pay contribution to WWF at the rate of two percent of their accounting or taxable income, whichever is higher. In this regard, a Constitutional Petition has been filed by certain CISs through their trustees in the Honourable High Court of Sindh (SHC), challenging the applicability of WWF to the CISs / pension funds, which is pending adjudication. However, without prejudice to the above, the Management Company has been providing for WWF contribution since the financial year ended 30 June 2010.

During the year ended 30 June 2011, a clarification was issued by the Ministry of Labour and Manpower (the Ministry) in on 8 July 2010 which stated that mutual funds are not liable to contribute to WWF on the basis of their income. However, in on 14 December 2010 the Ministry filed its response against the Constitutional Petition requesting the Court to dismiss the same. Show cause notices were then issued by Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) to several Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds for the collection of WWF including some of the mutual funds and a pension fund managed by the AMC. In respect of such show cause notices, certain Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds have been granted stay by Honourable SHC on the basis of the pending Constitutional Petition as referred above.

In March 2013, a three member bench of the Sindh High Court in its judgement on various Constitutional Petitions challenging the amendments brought in the WWF Ordinance, 1971 through the Finance Act, 2006 and the Finance Act, 2008, held that WWF is a tax and consequently, the amendments introduced in the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 through Finance Acts, 2006 and 2008 respectively (Money Bills) do not suffer from any constitutional or legal infirmity. This judgement was in contrast to the July 2011 single member bench decision of the Honourable Lahore High Court which had held such amendments as unlawful and unconstitutional for the reason that they were made through the money bills. For the CISs and Pension Funds, the issue of chargeability or otherwise of WWF levy to the CISs / Pension Funds is currently pending before the Honourable SHC.

In view of the pending decision, the Management Company of the Fund, as a matter of abundant caution, has continued to maintain the provision for WWF amounting to Rs.18,881,335 (30 June 2013: Rs.17,724,043) in these condensed interim financial statements. Had the same not been made, the net asset value per unit of the Fund would have been higher by Rs.7.48 (30 June 2013: Rs.8.95) per unit.

7. CONTINGENCIES AND COMMITMENTS

There were no contongencies and commitments outstandings as at 30 September 2013.

8. TAXATION

The Fund's income is exempt from Income Tax as per Clause 99 of Part I of the Second Schedule to the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 subject to the condition that not less than 90% of the accounting income for the year as reduced by capital gains whether realised or unrealised is distributed amongst the unit holders. Further, as per Regulation 63 of the Non-Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations, 2008, the Fund is required to distribute 90% of the net accounting income, other than unrealized capital gains to the unit holders. The management intends to distribute at least 90% of the Fund's net accounting income earned by the year end, if any, to the unit holders. Accordingly, no provision has been made for taxation in these condensed interim financial statements.

NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (UN-AUDITED) FOR THE PERIOD FROM 26 JUNE 2013 TO 30 SEPTEMBER 2013

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

- 1.1 Atlas Gold Fund (the Fund) is an open ended Fund constituted by a trust deed entered into on 6 May 2013 between Atlas Asset Management Limited (AAML) as the Management Company and Central Depository Company of Pakistan Limited (CDC) as the trustee. The investment activities and administration of the Fund are managed by AAML situated at Ground Floor, Federation House, Shahrae Firdousi, Clifton, Karachi.
- 1.2 Units of the Fund are offered for public subscription on a continuous basis since 15 July 2013, and are transferable and redeemable by surrendering them to the Fund. The Fund is listed on the Lahore Stock Exchange.
- 1.3 According to the trust deed, the objective of the Fund is to provide investors with capital appreciation through investment in gold or gold futures contracts traded on the Commodity Exchange. The Fund aims to deliver this objective mainly by investing at least 70% of the net assets in gold or gold futures contracts during the year based on quarterly average investments calculated on daily basis. The remaining net assets of the Fund shall be invested in cash and near cash instruments which includes cash in bank accounts (excluding TDR), and treasury bills not exceeding 90 days maturity. At least 10% of the net assets of the Fund shall remain invested in cash and near cash instruments at all times. The investment objectives and policy are more fully defined in the Fund's offering document.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan. Approved accounting standards comprise of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as are notified under the Companies Ordinance,1984, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the Non Banking Finance Companies (Establishment and Regulation) Rules, 2003 (the NBFC Rules), the Non Banking Finance Companies and Notified Entities Regulations 2008 (the NBFC Regulations) and directives issued by the SECP. Wherever the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules, the NBFC Regulations or the directives issued by the SECP differ with the requirements of IFRS, the requirements of the Trust Deed, the NBFC Rules, the NBFC Regulations or the requirements of the said directives prevail.

2.2 Critical accounting estimates and judgments

The preparation of these condensed interim financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the result of which form the basis of making judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities. The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis.

2.3 Accounting convention

These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for investments which are carried at fair value.

2.4 Functional and presentation currency

These condensed interim financial statements are presented in Pak Rupees, which is the Fund's functional and presentation currency.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are set out below:

3.1 Investments

The investments of the Fund, upon initial recognition, are classified as investment at fair value through income statement or available-for-sale investment, as appropriate.

All investments are initially measured at fair value plus, in the case of investments not at fair value through income statement, transaction costs that are directly attributable to acquisition.

All regular way purchases / sales of investments are recognised on the trade date, i.e. the date on which the Fund commits to purchase / sell the investment.

Investments at fair value through income statement

These include held-for-trading investments and such other investments that, upon initial recognition, are designated under this category. Investments are classified as held-for-trading if they are acquired for the purpose of selling in the near term. After initial measurement, such investments are carried at fair value and gains or losses on revaluation are recognised in the income statement. All derivatives are classified as held-for-trading.

Available-for-sale

Investments which are not classified in the preceding categories are classified as available-for-sale investments. After initial measurement, such investments are measured at fair value with unrealised gain or loss recognised directly in the statement of comprehensive income until the investment is derecognised or determined to be impaired at which time the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in the statement of comprehensive income is taken to the income statement.

3.2 Loans and receivables

These are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market.

Subsequent to initial recognition financial assets classified as loans and receivables are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Gain or loss is also recognised in the income statement when financial assets carried at amortised cost are derecognised or impaired.

3.3 Derivatives Financial Instruments

Derivative instruments that are held by the Fund primarily comprise of gold futures contracts in the commodities market. These are measured initially at fair value and revalued at each subsequent measurement date at their fair values which is calculated as being the net difference between the contract price and the closing price reported on the primary exchange of the futures commodities. Derivatives with the positive market values (unrealised gains) are included in assets and derivatives with the negative market value (unrealised losses) are included in liabilities in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities. The resultant gains and losses are included in the income statement.

3.4 Issue and redemption of units

Units issued are recorded at the offer price, determined by the management company for the application received by the distribution company / management company during business hours on that day. The offer price represents the Net Asset Value (NAV) per unit as of the close of the business day, plus the allowable sales load and provision of any duties and charges if applicable. The sales load is payable to the distribution company and the management company.

Units redeemed are recorded at the redemption price applicable to units for which the distribution company / management company receives redemption application during business hours of that day. The redemption price shall be equal to NAV as of the close of the business day, less an amount as the management company may consider to be an appropriate provision of duties and charges.

3.5 Revenue recognition

Interest income on government securities is recognised using effective interest method at the rate of return implicit in the instrument.

Interest income on bank balances and deposits is recognised on an accrual basis.

Gains or losses on sale of investments are included in the Income Statement in the period in which they arises.

Element of income / loss and capital gains / losses in prices of units issued less those in units redeemed is recognised when the units are issued and redeemed at the transaction date.

3.6 Expenses

All expenses chargeable to the Fund including remuneration of management company, trustee, and annual fee of the SECP are recognised in the income statement on an accrual basis.

3.7 Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Fund has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate of the obligation can be made. Provisions are regularly reviewed and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate.

3.8 Element of income / loss and capital gains / losses in prices of units sold less those in units redeemed

To prevent the dilution of per unit income and distribution of income already paid out on redemption as dividend, an equalisation account called "element of income / loss and capital gains / losses in prices of units issued less those in units redeemed" (the element) is created.

Upon sale and redemption of units, the amount representing net income / loss and capital gains/ losses accounted for in net asset value and included in the sale / redemption price is taken to the element account.

The element is computed to the extent that it is represented by the increase / decrease in net income / loss and capital gains / losses earned / incurred during the period.

3.9 Deferred formation cost

Formation cost refers to all the preliminary and floatation expenses of the Fund incurred upto the initial issue of units, to the extent allowable under the NBFC Regulations. These costs are being amortised over a period of five years commencing from July 2013, in accordance with the requirements of the NBFC Regulations. These expenses were paid off by the management company and are reimbursable to it by the Fund.

3.10 Taxation

The Fund is exempt from taxation under Clause 99 of the Part I of the 2nd Schedule of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001, subject to the condition that not less than 90% of its accounting income excluding realised and unrealised capital gains for the year is distributed amongst the Fund's unit holders. The Fund intends to avail this exemption for current and future periods. Accordingly, no provision is made for current and deferred taxation in these financial statements.

3.11 Financial instruments

All financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised at the time when the Fund becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to receive cash flows related to the asset expire. Financial liabilities are derecognised when they are extinguished, that is, when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled, or expires. Any gain or loss on derecognition of the financial assets and financial liabilities is taken to income statement.

3.12 Offsetting of financial assets and liabilities

Financial assets and financial liabilities are only offset and the net amount reported in the statement of assets and liabilities when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognised amount and the Fund intends to either settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

3.13 Distribution to unit holders

Distribution to unit holders is recognised upon declaration and approval by the Board of Directors of the management company.

Distributions declared subsequent to the year end reporting date are considered as non-adjusting events and are recognised in the financial statements of the period in which such distributions are declared and approved by the Board of Directors of the management company.

3.14 Net asset value per unit

The net asset value per unit disclosed in the statement of assets and liabilities is calculated by dividing the net assets of the Fund by the number of units in issue at the period end.

3.15 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include deposits with banks and other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

- 9.1 During the period, an amount of Rs.129,082 was charged on account of sales tax on remuneration of the Management Company levied through Sindh Sales Tax on Services Act, 2011, out of which Rs.66,582 has already been paid to the Management Company which acts as a collecting agent.
- 9.2 The Finance Act, 2013 has enlarged the scope of Federal Excise Duty (FED) on financial services to include Asset Management Companies (AMCs) with effect from 13 June 2013. As the asset management services rendered by the Management Company of the Fund are already subject to provincial sales tax on services levied by the Sindh Revenue Board, which is being charged to the Fund as explained in note 9.1 above, the Management Company is of the view that further levy of FED is not justified.

On 4 September 2013, a Constitutional Petition has been filed in Honorable Sindh High Court (SHC) jointly by various asset management Companies, together with their representative Collective Investment Schemes through their trustees, challenging the levy of FED. In this respect, the Hon'ble SHC has issued a stay order against recovery proceedings. The hearing of the petition is in progress.

In view of the pending decision, as a matter of abundant caution, the Management Company of the Fund has made a provision for FED in the books of account aggregating to Rs.111,277.

9.3 The Finance Act 2008 introduced an amendment to the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 (WWF Ordinance). As a result of this amendment it may be construed that all Collective Investment Schemes / Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds whose income exceeds Rs.0.5 million in a tax year, have been brought within the scope of the WWF Ordinance, thus rendering them liable to pay contribution to WWF at the rate of two percent of their accounting or taxable income, whichever is higher. In this regard, a Constitutional Petition has been filed by certain CISs through their trustees in the Honorable High Court of Sindh (SHC), challenging the applicability of WWF to the CISs / Pension Funds, which is pending adjudication.

During the year ended 30 June 2011, a clarification was issued by the Ministry of Labour and Manpower (the Ministry) on 8 July 2010 which stated that mutual funds are not liable to contribute to WWF on the basis of their income. However on 14 December 2010 the Ministry filed its response against the Constitutional Petition requesting the Court to dismiss the same. This response was contradictory to the earlier clarification issued by the Ministry. Show cause notices were then issued by Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) to several Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds for the collection of WWF including some of the mutual funds and a pension fund managed by the AMC. In respect of such show cause notices, certain Mutual Funds (CISs) / Pension Funds have been granted stay by Honorable SHC on the basis of the pending Constitutional Petition as referred above.

In March 2013, a three member bench of the Sindh High Court in its judgement on various Constitutional Petitions challenging the amendments brought in the WWF Ordinance, 1971 through the Finance Act, 2006 and the Finance Act, 2008, held that WWF is a tax and consequently, the amendments introduced in the Workers' Welfare Fund Ordinance, 1971 through Finance Acts, 2006 and 2008 respectively (Money Bills) do not suffer from any constitutional or legal infirmity. This judgement was in contrast to the July 2011 single member bench decision of the Honourable Lahore High Court which had held such amendments as unlawful and unconstitutional for the reason that they were made through the money bills. For the CISs and Pension Funds, the issue of chargeability or otherwise of WWF levy to the CISs / Pension Funds is currently pending before the Honourable SHC.

In view of the pending decision, the Management Company of the Fund, as a matter of abundant caution, has decided to continue to maintain the provision for WWF amounting to Rs.50,046 in these condensed interim financial statements. Had the same not been made the net asset value per unit of the Fund would have been higher by Re.0.02.
